Emotional Intelligence Predicts Academic Performance

This meta-analysis shows that emotional intelligence has a small to moderate association with academic performance, such that students with higher emotional intelligence tend to gain higher grades and achievement test scores The association is stronger for skill-based emotional intelligence tasks than rating scales of emotional intelligence
